# Album with 202 Woodblock Printed Paper Samples

### Unique selection with a wonderful variety of designs

[Japan] An impressive sample book containing 202 coloured, woodblock printed, Japanese illustrated templates of varying sizes that were probably designed for use as menus, advertising, flyers, and greeting cards. The vast majority are woodblock printed although some appear to be chromolithographs. Each sample is numbered in blue pencil to make ordering a particular design simple. A few of the designs have the name 'Sato' in the design and this was probably the company in Japan that produced the designs or possibly the artist's name.

## Two Japanese Photo Albums by Adolfo Farsari

### Impressive albums with a total of 110 photos

[Japan] Two impressive albums with beautiful, decorative Japanese lacquer covers in surprisingly good condition from the studio of Yokohama-based Italian photographer, Adolfo Farsari (1841-98). Both albums were bought and owned by the British musician/composer Paul Bevan, who was the first treasurer (c1892) of the Japanese Society of London and is known to have visited Japan in 1889. Each album has most of its interleaves and many are printed with Farsari's name along with some photography-related text and each also has one of the Farsari studio's composite advertising photos at the beginning. Acquired from a descendant of Bevan's. One album contains 59 photos and the other has 51 photos (incl. the Farsari composite photos).

Each album approx. 36.5 x 29cm.

Both albums in very good condition. The Japanese lacquerware covers and binding are in an unusually good state of preservation. No chipping to the lacquer but some gold powder is starting to come away. Most of the tissue interleaves have foxing but they are loose as issued and have protected the photos very nicely. The first leaf or two of one album has an old stain at the bottom of the mount but overall the pages are very good with only minor wear and occasionally minor spotting. p35031374

[Japan] A super woodblock printed triptych showing the British Legation on the Yokohama Bluff and a group of English soldiers marching along the street in front of a few bystanders. With the English caption, the publisher of the print, Morookaya Ihei (spelt Morohcaya on the print) clearly aimed to sell such prints to Westerners as well as Japanese people.

Akiyama specifically as the publisher and Nishii Saikyo as the printer. It is also slightly larger than the Kelly & Walsh edition.

[Japan] A striking, hand-drawn and coloured scroll showing, step-by-step, the proper way for a samurai to dress. This informative work covers all eighteen steps, including underwear, sleeve guards, arrow and quiver, gloves, armour, sword and so on, in the correct order. Ise (Heizo) Sadatake (1718-84) wrote numerous illustrated works on the correct protocol for samurai and this scroll appears to date from the late Edo era (c1800-1840). The scroll is titled, 'Yoshiie Ason Yoroi Chakuyō Shidai' in Japanese.

## Woodblock Printed Map of Shimoda Port

### Large, coloured and dated map

[Japan] Impressive map of Shimoda and its surrounds. Published in the wake of the Perry missions to Japan in 1853 and 1854. Gyokusenji Temple in Shimoda was designated as the location for the United States' first consulate with Townsend Harris and Henry Heusken living there from 1856 before relocating to Azabu (Tokyo) in 1859. The map is titled in Japanese, 'Zushu Shimoda Minato no Zu' ['Map of Shimoda Port in Izu Province'].

# Exhibition Poster of the Shunyokai Art Association

### **Designed by Kimura Shohachi**

[Japan] The Shunyokai was founded in 1922 by a group of Japanese artists including Adachi Gen'ichiro, Kurata Hakuyo, Kosugi Ho'on, Yamamoto Kanae, and Kimura Shohachi (1893-1958), who designed this poster. Their first exhibition was held in 1923 although no poster appears to have been made. This is the first known poster of the Shunyokai exhibition and was made for their second exhibition that was held at the Mitsukoshi department store in 1924. The Shunyokai still exists today and has about 270 members.

## Large Pre-War Nagasaki Tourism Poster

### **Designed by Nakayama Yoshitaka**

[Japan] Very scarce poster designed by Nakayama Yoshitaka (1888-1969) and published by the Nagasaki Tourism Association in 1935. Nakayama was born in Nagasaki and was a self-taught painter who received first prize and an honourable mention for his poster submitted to the International Industrial Tourism Exposition in 1933. After the War, in 1951, he became a founding member of the Japan Advertising Art Association and was in charge of the Kyushu region. The top portion of the poster is affixed to a larger sheet of soft card and is captioned in English, 'No.48 FUMITAKA NAKAYAMA TOURISM 1935', indicating the poster was probably exhibited at some point. Note that although 'Fumitaka' is the more common reading of his given name, the correct reading in his case is, 'Yoshitaka'.

[Japan] A superb hand fan in its original woodblock printed, decorative paper folder. Both sides show floral scenes and the fan has a beautiful, lacquered wooden handle. Haibara still operates in Nihonbashi, Tokyo and was founded in 1806. Haibara Naojiro (1846-1910) was the 3rd generation owner of the store. We decided not to remove the fan from the folder so have not photographed the reverse side in order to keep it in pristine condition.

## Scarce, Early Issue of The Hiogo News

### Saturday, August 24th 1872

[Japan] The Hiogo News was the earliest English newspaper published in Kobe (Hyogo) with the first issue coming out on April 23rd, 1868. It was published twice a week on Wednesday and Saturday. Along with numerous advertisements, there are also articles about the criminal trial against a Mr. Tryon, who was fined \$5, for assaulting a Mr. Johnson and Mr. Walsh (proprietors of the Hiogo News). Also, a lengthy article on a British man named J. Noble who apparently died in pitiful conditions locked up in a small cage near the Customs house at Osaka.

## Sketches of the Lives and Religious Work of Ten Representative Japanese Unitarians

[Japan] Very scarce work that looks at the Unitarian Mission in Japan along with its American advocates, Rev. A.M. Knapp (1841-1921), Rev. Clay MacCauley (1843-1923), Rev. W.H. Hawkes, and Rev. W.I. Lawrence. The ten key Japanese members covered are: Saji Jitsunen (1856-1920), Kanda Saichiro (1863-1944), Kishimoto Nobuta (1866-1928), Murai Tomoyoshi (1861-1944), Noguchi Zenshiro (c1864-?), Ogasawara Yoshio (1868-1945), Toyosaki Zennosuke (1863 - ?), Abe Isoo (1865-1949), Hirai Kinza (1859-1916), and Shimada Saburo (1852-1923). Each individual has written his own life summary and reason for becoming a Unitarian. Ownership ink stamp on front cover of William Channing Gannett (1840-1923), another Unitarian pastor. Beautifully illustrated front cover.

[Japan] Five early issues of this important publication by The Asiatic Society of Japan that was founded in 1872 and is still active today. A range of articles including Minerals and Metallurgy by Geerts, Vegetable Wax by Henry Gribble, a Trip to Niigata by J. Lindo, Constructive Art by R.H. Brunton, Japanese Legends by C.W. Goodwin, The Yonezawa Dialect by C.H. Dallas, Copper Bells, Japanese Wood, a Visit to Okinawa, Arrow Poison used by Ainu, The Bonin [Ogasawara] Islands, Cotton, Japanese Heraldry, a Trip to Vries Island [Izu Oshima], The Introduction of Tobacco to Japan by Satow, and many others. 

# Conversations in Japanese & English (with a Copious Vocabulary)

### by F. Lowder

Conversations in Japanese & English compiled for the use of Visitors and Residents. By F. Lowder, Interpreter in Her Majesty's Consular Service in Japan. Part I - June 1867. Very scarce and very early work by John Frederick Lowder (1843-1902), who arrived in Japan in 1861 and worked as an interpreter at the British consulate in Yokohama. It appears that only this Part I was ever published. The final section contains a very interesting sample dialogue between a Westerner and a samurai in English and romanized Japanese under the title, 'Parley with Two-Sworded Men' (who look menacing). It begins with a character named Jones who says, 'Have we done anything impolite towards you in any way?', to which the reply is given, 'Yes! Why don't you get off your horse? That's impolite when a samurai is passing along!'. Jones then says, 'Is it! It is the custom of my country not to dismount from a horse even tho' an officer be passing!' and ends with a final warning by the samurai, 'Is it! This is Japan; and in Japan if one doesn't dismount we cut him down!' Of course this was just five years after the Namamugi Incident and three years after the Kamakura Incident so Lowder obviously thought such phrases in Japanese would be useful. Yokohama. 

# Woodblock Printed Advertisement for Canemori Mise Hakodate

#### **Watanabe Kumashiro**

[Japan] Large, woodblock printed advertisement showing the main building of the Canemori Mise [Kanemori Store] in Hakodate. Signs on the building list some of the products they sold, including chicken curry, liquor, and other foodstuffs. Kanemori was founded by Watanabe Kumashiro in 1869 and he imported, bought and sold a wide range of products. An almost identical print is known to be dated 1880, so ours most likely dates a little later than that. Although the printing quality is a bit basic, it is a scarce item. There is an artist signature on the right but we haven't been able to decipher it. The warehouses he opened later are a tourist attraction in Hakodate today and the final (website) image shows the building today.



[Japan] Scarce catalogue printed on fibrous Japanese paper listing 179 paintings and woodblock prints along with prices. Kobayashi's preface states that prints by Iwasa Matabei and Hokusai, '....have become so scarce that it is hardly possible to get a collection of them in the country [Japan]'. Prices range from 2 yen all the way up to 300 yen for a Hokusai painting, 400 yen for an Utamaro print, and 800 yen for a painted screen by Iwasa Matabei, a huge sum in those days.



## CDV of Identified Japanese Ambassadors

### **Taken in London by Caldesi**

[Japan] Wonderful carte de visite showing four members of the First Japanese embassy to Europe taken in London in 1862. From left to right: Kawasaki Domin (1831-81), Saito Dainoshin (1822-71), Okazaki Tozaemon (c1835-?), and Ota Genzaburo (1835-95). Kawasaki was a doctor from Saga, Saito was from prsent day Gunma prefecture and is known to have helped repel an attack on the British Legation at Tozenji in Edo in 1861. Okazaki was one of the officials and Ota was an interepreter. Leonida Caldesi (1822-91) was an Italian-born photographer who had a studio in London from around 1860 to 1866.

## CDV of T. Van Lissa

#### Taken in Yokohama in 1868

[Japan] Very scarce CDV on a mount labelled 'Cebr. Van Lissa' [Van Lissa Brothers] 'Photografen Yokohama'. Mysteriously, T. Van Lissa (sometimes J. Van Lissa which may be a typo) and A.H Van Lissa only appear in the Japan Directories from around 1871 until 1884, and were apparently instrument makers and armourers located at No.10 in Yokohama. This photo appears to be of T. Van Lissa and is presumably signed and dated by him 31 October 1868. Whether they were actually photographers or selling photographs with their own mounts is still a mystery.

## Early Photos of Kobe-based Westerners

### including Marshall's House and race-winning horse 'Torpedo'

[Japan] Fascinating group of 18 albumen photos relating to Kobe, Japan and China mounted on five leaves of paper. One large photo of an impressive Western-style residence is captioned, 'Marshall's House Icida', and is most likely the home of John Marshall (1833-87), who moved to Kobe in 1870 and became the Harbour Master there. 'Icida' would appear to refer to the photographer Ichida Sota (1843-96), who established a photo studio in Kobe around 1870. The other large photo is titled, '"Torpedo" - Winner of Grand Annual Welter & Spring Selling Stakes Spring Meeting 1872', and shows the horse along with a *betto*, the jockey, and a Westerner (possibly John Marshall). One page contains three small photos captioned, 'The Captain' [presumably John Marshall], 'The Japanese steamer 'Coila' - belonging to the Prince of Higo', and, 'The Officers', showing three Western men with a Chinese man and Japanese lady. Another page shows an unidentified Western man with a Japanese lady, a known Beato image of two Japanese ladies and a photo of the Kamakura daibutsu as well as five small photos of Chinese ladies on the rear. The final page shows three small photos of Chinese people and two of scenery, presumably in China.



### Eboshi Iwa near Enoshima

### Large format albumen photo

[Japan] Scarce view of the rock known as Eboshi Iwa which is located near Enoshima. The rock is similar in shape to a type of black, lacquered cap that was worn in the Heian era, known as an *eboshi*, hence the name. Two men and a boy appear to be enjoying a day on the rock. The final (website) photo shows the rock today. Captioned in the negative at lower right, 'Q76 EBOSHIYUWA (A ROCK) NEAR ENOSHIMA'.
