

Pictures of One Hundred Demons

[Japan] A masterpiece by Kawanabe Kyosai (1831-1889), who was nicknamed, 'The Painting Demon'. Sometimes translated as, 'Night Parade of One Hundred Demons', this Japanese orihon is a feast for the eyes. The variety of ghastly ghouls, goblins, and other fantastic beasts is amazing. First published in 1890 (the year after Kyosai's death), this is a second edition published in 1895. Both editions are very scarce, especially so in good condition.

[Japan] Very impressive and uncommon work by a Shiga prefecture-based company run by Nishiyama Kihei, with branch offices in Tokyo and Kyoto. An impressive array of 100 numbered designs in multiple colours. Marked 'Not for Sale' in Japanese on colophon page.

Keiran Gafu - Colour lithographs of orchids

Large, impressive work

[Japan] A large, impressive book with colour lithographs of *keiran*, a plant in the orchid family that doesn't flower, rather, having nice patterns in their leaves. Growing them became a private hobby in the Edo era amongst lords and other people of means. The designs of the pots used for the plants were also beautifully designed and form part of the display. Edited by Hikita Keizo who selected 30 masterpieces from the collections of various families. Hikita apparently studied Western painting from the Italian painter Antonio Fontanesi (1818-1882) at the Technical Fine Arts School in Tokyo.



Collection of 90 Woodblock Printed Envelope Samples

Wonderful array of designs

[Japan] Superb selection of 90 different woodblock printed designs of actual envelopes used to hold gift money. This first volume is titled 'Shu Shu' in Japanese and was followed by a second and third volume published the following year in 1925. Edited by the Hiroo Shoeido Ishokubu and sold by Sakuraiya in the Kansai area and by Kogeisha in the Kanto area. Each envelope measures 9 x 4cm.

Superb woodblock printed map of Yokohama

by Utagawa Yoshikazu

[Japan] One of the nicest, early maps of Yokohama showing the port with numerous vessels and the surrounding area. Yoshikazu produced a number of woodblock prints of foreigners and foreign-related scenes of Yokohama. The colophon states that the map was first published in 1865 and this is a reprint of 1868. We have never seen an 1865 edition of the map. The publisher, Morookaya Ihei also published other woodblock prints and books targeted at foreigners in Japan. The photographer, Shimooka Renjo, rented a building from Morookaya for his first photo studio in 1862 at No.5 Bentendori. Signed at lower left, Ichikawa Yoshikazu.

Manuscript Book of Kusudama for each month

Beautifully hand-drawn and coloured


[Japan] Impressive manuscript titled, 'Teika Junigatsu no Kusudama', containing twelve designs of socalled 'medicine balls' which were used for incense and pot pourri. Originally, they were made of real flowers as in these illustrations, but recently are more likely to be made of paper. Each month has a different seasonal flower so, for example, February shows cherry blossoms, March wisteria, May irises, and October chrysanthemums. The 'Teika' in the title refers to poet Fujiwara no Teika (1162-1241), who was known to have written poems to go with kusudama. The manuscript was written in Keio 3 (1867) as indicated in the rear of the book.

[Japan] Early manuscript detailing the various processes involved in photography along with the necessary equipment. Sections include dark rooms, temporary dark rooms, polishing glass, lenses, daylight, duplicating photos, chemicals, and albumen prints. Illustrated with numerous diagrams, such comprehensive manuscripts in Japanese (almost 300 pages) are very scarce and this one is a beauty.

Illustrated Account of Contests Between Hand-game Players

[Japan] Very interesting pair of books that looks at the various hand-games (such as rock-paperscissors etc.) played in Japan in the old days. Illustrated very nicely by Shokosai (aka Shoko or Hanbei), who was active around 1795-1809, the book also contains a list of the various clubs and members in Osaka, Kyoto and Nagasaki. A Meiji edition was published in 1883, this is the first edition of 1809. Bound together in one volume as issued.

Shuko Monyo - Japanese Woodblock Printed Design Books

Complete set of 5 volumes

[Japan] Scarce set of 5 *orihon* volumes containing a huge array of Japanese patterns and designs, woodblock printed in colour by Kawarazaki Kodo. Single volumes appear sometimes but this is the first complete set we have seen, probably because the books were published individually over a 3-year period just prior to the Second World War.



Two Visits to the Island of Saghalien and the Gulf of Tartary

Scarce work by Mrs. Emily S. Patton

[Japan] Published just after Japan seized control of the territory from Russia towards the end of the Russo-Japanese War in 1905, but actually about visits made in 1897-1898 by Patton. Saghalien [Sakhalin], or Karafuto in Japanese, was well known as a penal colony. With lithograph of the port of Korsakoff (based on a sketch by Patton) and a map on verso, this is a very scarce publication. Inscribed, 'Mr. William Abbs, from Mrs. Patton, April 1909', at top of front cover. Emily Sophia Patton (1831-1912) was a British-born Australian who lived in Japan from 1889 until her death. She taught music and wrote a couple of other books on Japan.

Note Explicative sur La Tenture de Mur 'Tsuzure-Nishiki'

Destinée à la Décoration du Palais de la Paix

[Japan] Ouevre Exécutée par la Maison Kawashima Jimbei. Scarce, illustrated booklet describing the story behind the nine embroidered silk wall hangings that were produced by Kyoto-based silk merchant, Kawashima Jimbei for the opening of the Peace Palace in the Hague that opened in 1913. The building houses the International Court of Justice. The artist was Kikuchi Hobun (1862-1918) and apparently took three years to complete. He was assisted by his apprentice, Yamada Koun (1878-1956). The wall hangings are still in the Peace Palace today.

[Japan] Very scarce, illustrated catalogue with hand-coloured designs of Arita porcelain. The head office of Arita Tojiki was in Saga prefecture (Arita town where the famous pottery originated) and, as the cover states, they had an export office in Nagoya. Considering that the English in this catalogue is typed, it would appear to date from around the 1940s. Printed on very fine Japanese paper that is almost transparent.



[Japan] Scarce book covering the voyage of H.M.S. Barfleur (launched 1892 and scrapped in 1910) from the Mediterranean to her appointment on the China Station in 1898. The full title is, 'A Review of the Commission of H.M.S. "Barfleur" on the Mediterranean and China Stations 1895-98'. Palmer mentions in the preface that he had thought he was writing the book with two other shipmates but it turned out it was only he. Also, he asks readers to excuse any grammatical errors as he only had a very elementary education. In fact, the book is very readable and interesting. The humorous, fold-out map in the rear is present as issued.



Scarce guide to Japan and China with a note on Korea by Eliza Ruhamah Scidmore (1856-1928), well known for her book 'Jinrikisha Days in Japan'. The first edition was supposedly published in 1891, but this 4th edition appears to be the first edition that is actually known. Perhaps any earlier editions were published under different, or slightly different, titles.

Signed letter from Josiah Conder to Mrs North

Regarding dyed fibre paper samples

[Japan] Signed letter from renowned British architect, Josiah Conder (1852-1920), written on personal paper embossed with his Tokyo address ('25 Mikawadai Machi, Azabu, Tokio') at top right. Conder mentions that the only place that makes such dyed fibre paper is in Kakegawa (western Shizuoka). It is unclear who Mrs. North is, but Conder writes that he could send his paperhanger to her, so that implies she may have been living in Japan.

[Japan] Scarce photo of US physician, educator and missionary, Duane B. Simmons (1834-89), taken one year before his death. Simmons was one of the first Westerners to live in Japan, arriving in 1859 along with Guido Verbeck and Samuel Robbins Brown. This image is larger than a carte de visite but smaller than a cabinet card.
