





**with 156 wonderful designs**

[Japan] One of the most impressive complete sets of early, kimono design books in colour that we have seen. The books were edited and published by Yamanaka Kichirobei (1847-1917) of Osaka who was known as, 'The King of Antiques'. The Japanese title is 'Moyo Hinagata Naniwa no Ume'.

The detail and quality are superb. At least one later edition was published in 1933. This is the first edition of 1903. The text was by Inokuma Asamaro and the woodblocks by Furuya Korin.

[Japan] Interesting work with 26 plates of colour illustrations showing designs and cutting guidelines for making artificial flowers as well as one plate of butterflies at the beginning. Yoshizumi Shoten published the book and that company appears to have been managed by a lady, Ms. Haru (or Haruko) Yoshizumi. A second edition was published in 1928.

## Superb, dated Japanese photo album with 120 photos

**with previously unknown photos of Georges Bigot and friends in Japanese costume**

[Japan] Important album captioned in French with previously unknown, dated photos of Georges Bigot dressed in Japanese clothes [as a samurai] with three other French men named Toussaint [dressed as a woman], Gilbert [as a police officer], and Renard [as a rickshaw puller on a rainy day]. Interestingly, there are two copies of this photograph at the beginning of the album so it would seem quite likely that the original owner was one of these four men. R. Toussaint and M. Renard worked for De Vegan & Co. in Yokohama and a J. Gilbert worked for Hecht, Lilienthal & Co. according to the Japan Directory of 1883. The album contains a range of both portrait images and scenery. A number of the large format photos match the numbering system of Usui Shuzaburo and at least one of the smaller photos appears to have a background that Kanamaru Genzo was known to use. Others are by Stillfried. The two photos pasted inside the front and rear covers are probably related to an exhibition or exposition of ceramics. At the end of the album is an unusual, fold-out printed by the chief priest of the Kamakura daibutsu in English asking for donations to re-erect it. There is also one loose sheet with a small woodblock print of a lady walking at night. Dated 1882 at the beginning of the album, the year Bigot first arrived in Japan.

## Unique Japanese Folding Album with 77 Photos

**with only known photo of Percival Spencer flying with balloon in Tokyo**

[Japan] Very interesting folding album containing 77 photos and one small page of text. The album also has a very important photo that may well be the only known photo of British balloonist, Percival Spencer, flying in the air at the National Museum at Ueno Park in Tokyo on November 24, 1890. The caption in Japanese is dated and mentions Spencer by name. His flights in Kobe, Yokohama and Tokyo were covered comprehensively in the English and Japanese newspapers, but no references to photographs of the flights have been found. The album may have been compiled by a military person as there are also photos of a dry dock, one of the Chishima (a Japanese Navy cruiser that sank in November 1892 when the British merchant vessel Ravenna collided with it off Matsuyama), views of Enoshima, Matsushima, Nikko, Oiso, Kyoto, Ryounkaku in Asakusa, Tokyo, Kamakura, Captain and explorer Shigetada Gunji, Yasumasa Fukushima (with typed page about him on facing page), and Ikaho hot spring.

## CDVs of Kido Takamasa (Kuruhara Hikotaro)

### Taken in Massachusetts when at high school

[Japan] Kuruhara Hikotaro (1857-1917) was a Japanese palace official and politician of the Choshu clan. He was the eldest son of Kuruhara Ryozo (1829-62) and Wada Haruko (? - 1875), who was the younger sister of Kido Takayoshi (1833-77) aka Katsura Kogoro. Hikotaro went to the US to study at Amherst College from 1871-75 when these photos were taken. Hikotaro's younger brother, Shojiro, became the adopted son of Kido Takayoshi, but when he died of liver disease in 1880 at 24 years old on board a ship near Sri Lanka when returning to Japan from Germany, Hikotaro became head of the Kido family that same year. He was then known as Kido Takamasa and was the father of Kido Koichi (1889-1977). Two of the CDVs show Hikotaro posing in a studio (one signed, 'Kuruhara Hikotaro' in Japanese, the other signed, 'Hiko Kurubara' in English), one shows Hikotaro sitting outside with two Western friends presumably, the other is an unidentified Japanese student, who was probably a friend of Hikotaro's. Note that Hikotaro's original family name is known to have been spelled Kuruhara, Kurubara, Kurihara and Kuribara but, assuming he himself wrote his name in English on the back of one photo, he clearly spells it Kurubara.

### **Paymaster of HBM corvette 'Charybdis'**



Colwell is listed in the 'Chronicle and Directory for China, Japan and the Philippines etc.' (Hong Kong 1875) as the paymaster of the HBM corvette 'Charybdis'. The photo is inscribed on the rear, 'Yokohama Japan. R. M. Colwell. Paymaster. "Charybdis" 1875', presumably in Colwell's hand. HMS Charybdis was built in 1859 and served on the China Station (which included Japan) from 1873.

### Kimbei Photo Studio

[Japan] Very scarce catalogue of the latest camera and accessories available in Japan in 1906. The very modern cover design shows two women and two men in a car with the lady in the front passenger seat holding a camera. There were very few cars in Japan in 1906 so Kimbei obviously wanted to show how modern his products were. The catalogue contains numerous cameras, from pocket Kodaks to stereo cameras, box brownies, and large models up to 230 yen which was a huge sum in 1906. Kusakabe Kimbei (1841-1934) was one of Japan's most successful photographers and, later, photographic equipment dealers.



## Original Letter about early 1853 Visit to Japan

### Puzzling, pre-Perry trip to Japan

[Japan] A single page written on both sides and clearly dated, 'New York March 1853' at top right. The author is writing to his mother, presumably Alice J. Middleton, whose name is written down the bottom left at the end of the letter. The writer's name is challenging to decipher, but it appears to be 'Dannie'. He describes leaving on Dec. 28th [1852] his, '...native land [New York] for the cold, distant Japan', on the 'Star' [presumably the extreme clipper Shooting Star] and arriving in Brazil on 'the 14th day after we left' [which would be Jan. 11, 1853]. He gives a brief description of Brazil and its products and climate. After a few days there the ship went around Cape Horn on the way to California, stopping a few days in San Francisco. From there to Japan they encountered a violent storm but, '...soon after were surprised to find ourselves within the limits of Japan...', and, '...we continued traveling until we reached Jeddo [Yedo/Tokyo], where we remained during our stay in Japan. The country is nothing like I expected to find it, though I must say I like it very much.' He goes on to describe the features of Japanese people and the main products of Japan. Lastly, he writes, 'After spending three months in Japan, I took the ship the 25th Feb for a speedy journey homewards.....and after a month had passed after leaving Japan I landed safely at home determined never to go again.' Signed, 'Your Affct [Affectionate] Child, Dannie'. The dates in the letter are also mysterious as it seems like his stay was more like 1 month than the 3 months mentioned. In another hand at the end of the letter, someone has written, 'White Brocade 14 yds', and below that, 'Satin slippers' [sic].

Some of the ranks listed include, *robun*, *banto*, *bugyo*, *yonin*, *metsuke*, and even the lanterns used by government doctors. The date December 1868 and the name Sudo (or Shudo) Magotaro are written inside the rear cover. Sudo may have written the manuscript or could have been the original owner of it.

It seems an early owner (probably the original owner) had a selection of 30 prints from the series mounted into an album. The covers appear to be Meiji era too. Each woodblock print is numbered at the lower right in this order: 28, 14, 33, 42, 17, 15, 16, 50, 45, 40, 46, 30, 27, 26, 25, 32, 48, 13, 41, 36, 19, 29, 47, 8, 37, 12, 54, 24, 22, and 34.





Subjects include: Early Foreign References to Hyogo; Visit of Sir Rutherford Alcock; The Delay in the Opening of Hyogo; Choosing a Site for the Foreign Settlement at Kobe; The Attack of Bizen Men on Foreigners at Hyogo; Kobe in a State of Siege; Accommodation for the Foreign Merchants; The Massacre at Sakai; Sale of Settlement Lots; First Buildings on Kobe Settlement; Kobe and Its Surroundings in 1869; Establishment of Newspapers; Masonry in Kobe; Amusements and Recreation of the Settlers; Clubs and Other Institutions; Ships and Shipping; The End of Foreign Jurisdiction; The Romance of Kobe (by Miss Gertrude Cozad); My Early Kobe Reminiscences (by John Carey Hall CMG); Interviews with Old Residents (Mr. Ferdinand Plate, Mrs. Drewell, Mr. P.S. Cabeldu, Captain Swain, Mr. George Y. Taylor). The publication was edited by D. J. Evans (manager of The Japan Chronicle). Although a colour reproduction of two old Japanese prints is mentioned, this is not present.



