Sono no Kaori - Stunning Japanese design book

with 10 superb woodblock prints by 10 different artists

[Japan] With the title meaning something like, 'The Fragrant Garden', this book is a masterpiece of late-Meiji era woodblock printing. With artists (in order) Iwasaki Shoun, Ogino Issui, Kano Hisahide, Kataoka Hokusen, Yao Jakusen, Furuya Setsuzan, Kobayashi Gyokunen, Goto Ryuko, Mizuta Yasuhiro, and Shimomura Tamahiro providing one design each, this book really is a feast for the eyes. The birds in Setsuzan's print have been made to look slightly blurred to give the impression of movement. Gyokunen's red squares on black design is simply ahead of its time. Under the title on the cover is faintly written 'Maki no ichi' [Volume 1] but it appears further volumes may not have been published. The book is an orihon but, interestingly, does have a red spine covering that is a little deteriorated. Such luxurious, woodblock printed productions rarely appear on the market.

Each print dated at far right edge with publishing info at far left edge. The English is in a beautiful font but has some grammatical issues. Housed in later custom made folding case.

Each volume contains 15 leaves with designs (with titles on facing pages) and a contents page. Volume 1 also has a 2-page preface in Japanese script. The National Diet Library has volumes 2 and 3, but not volume 1. Not recorded elsewhere.

Kyushu University and Doshisha University also only have volume 1. The National Diet Library has both volumes but their volume 1 is missing some of the illustrations.

Published for the World's Columbian Exposition in Chicago

[Japan] Very scarce guide to Kyoto and the artists who exhibited at the Chicago World's Fair in 1893. Even scarcer in such good condition and with the personal business card of Keisuke Niwa (1856-1941), who was a Councillor of the Imperial Japanese Commission, and Honorary Commissioner of the Kyoto Exhibitors' Association for the Fair. He is also listed as a participant under the Carving Department (presumably wood or ivory carving). The book contains 16 colour woodblock prints by artists including Kono Bairei, Imao Keinen, Suzuki Shonen, Keizan, Kamisaka Sekka, and Tanaka Yuho. There is also a list of all the Kyoto artists who participated in the Fair. Towards the rear of the book is a thank you note to, 'Miss Mary G. Prince for valuable assistance rendered in the preparation of the preceeding pages.' Presumably, Miss Prince was the daughter of Isabella G. Prince and they are both listed in the 1892 Japan Directory as being instructors at the Higher Female School in Tokyo.

A difficult book to find these days, the covers have crepe paper covered boards, with the pages inside all woodblock printed on fine Japanese paper. The font used looks very similar to the original font Hasegawa Takejiro made for some of the books he published but there is no mention of Hasegawa. Made to look like it is bound fukurotoji (pocket) style but the pages are actually glued together at the edge as issued.



Report of the Commissioner of the Imperial Mint

5 issues covering the early years

[Japan] Scarce publications in English giving an interesting look at the activities of the Tokyo sub-branch of Japan's Mint in the five years from 1879 to 1884 (except 1881). The reports contain detailed information on gold and silver and copper bullion imports, the number of coins struck, the number of medals struck, and so on. William Gowland and Robert MacLagan are listed as foreign employees of the Mint. Much of the information is directed to Okuma Shigenobu (Minister of Finance), who later founded Waseda University. There are even records of employees who had illnesses and names of VIP visitors from abroad. Also some fold-out charts/tables.

[Japan] One of the nicest crepe paper books not published by Hasegawa Takejiro. This book tells the famous Japanese story of the Forty-Seven Ronin who avenged the death of their master in 1702. There are 53 woodlock printed illustrations of those involved in the events (the 47 ronin, 2 lords, 2 wives, 1 supplier of equipment and 1 young man who later killed himself after his father didn't let him take part in the revenge). The large, woodblock printed, crepe paper fold-out is also present as issued.

No slipcase present.

The Japanese colophon states '9th edition' but we believe this was just copied using a woodblock from the 9th edition of the crepe paper version. Presumably came in a slipcase but one is not present here. The photo with two books shows the *hosho* paper edition on the right and the crepe paper edition on the left. This listing is only for the *hosho* paper edition.



Stereo Photo of Tateishi Onojiro or 'Tommy'

Taken in New York by C.D. Fredricks

[Japan] Very scarce stereoview showing Tateishi 'Tommy' Onojiro (who was the youngest member at seventeen years old to join the First Japanese Embassy to the US in 1860) next to a samurai named Ozutsu. Tateishi (1843-1917) was a trainee interpreter and became the most popular member of the group. Nicknamed 'Tommy' by the Americans, his cheerful nature and good looks made him extremely popular - especially with the American ladies. Apparently, he was fond of beer and there was even a piece of music named after him called the 'Tommy Polka'. The C.D. Fredricks studio label on the rear reads, 'Japanese Embassy. Left Figure. Ozutzu [Ozutsu]. Soldier. Next figure. Tateish Onegero [Tateishi Onojiro], or Tommy, Noble, Interpreter.' One of the earliest photographs of Japanese people.

Stereo Photo of Japanese Officials in US

One of the earliest photos taken of Japanese people

[Japan] Extremely scarce stereo photo (or stereoview) showing five Japanese men who were part of the first Japanese embassy to the United States. The Kanrin Maru set sail from Uraga for San Francisco under Katsu Kaishū, with Nakahama "John" Manjiro as official translator, carrying 96 Japanese men and an American officer, John M. Brooke on board. The Japanese embassy itself traveled aboard the USS Powhatan, which the Kanrin Maru escorted. The Embassy travelled from Washington DC on June 5th or 6th and arrived in Philadelphia on June 9th after a brief stop in Baltimore, so it is likely that this photo was taken in Baltimore by F. W. & R. King as it has their seller's stamp on the rear. The view is titled (in pencil) on rear, '1860 Japan Embassy To US. Poss. taken in Baltimore', and below that a note, 'Wood plank floor not like the Fredericks views.' Small stamp reading. 'Porter Collection' at lower right on rear.



Fascinating photographic equipment catalogue

[Japan] Very scarce and important 300-page catalogue of the Osaka-based photographic equipment company run by Shozaburo Kuwada and his sons. We believe it contains the only known image of Kuwada himself and his sons. The catalogue also contains photographic illustrations of their showrooms and stores as well as the huge range of equipment they dealt in. The section on photographic mounts is also interesting in that it shows Kuwada was supplying many well known Japanese photographers of the time including Ueno Hikoma of Nagasaki and Tamemasa of Kobe, along with others in Seoul, Shanghai and Russia.

[Japan] Fascinating woodblock print by Gountei Sadahide (1807-1878 or 79) who was also known by the names Utagawa Sadahide, Hashimoto Sadahide and Gyokuransai Sadahide. He went to the International Exposition of 1867 in Paris and exhibited some prints there. Famous for his Yokohama prints and maps, his work, like this one, is usually of very high quality. The right panel of this triptych shows Japanese customers negotiating with the Western merchants. There are large books on display and an elephant outside. A Chinese man is standing at the far fight. The centre panel shows the bookkeepers looking at the numbers as well as some large bottles and containers behind them. The left panel shows people preparing meat and poultry. Interestingly, the only person who is described is the lady washing at lower right. The label states, 'Black lady washing'. The man at the lower left who is preparing a pheasant or duck also appears to be of African origin. Each panel stamped Gountei Sadahide and with the publisher's seal.


