

## Price List of Japanese Bulbs, Plants, Seeds, etc.

#### **Exported by L. Boehmer & Co.**

[Japan] Very scarce, woodblock printed, crepe paper catalogue and price list made for Yokohama-based nurseryman Louis Boehmer by Hasegawa Takejiro. We believe that catalogues on crepe paper made for Boehmer were only published from 1892 to 1896 after which he moved towards plain paper works. Interestingly, this particular price list mentions Alfred Unger as a new business partner of Boehmer's.



# L. Boehmer & Co's Catalogue of Japanese Plants, Bulbs & Seeds

### Beautiful book by Hasegawa Takejiro

[Japan] Superb, important catalogue that Louis Boehmer (1843-96) commissioned Hasegawa to make for him. Hasegawa cleverly reused a number of woodlock prints from other books he published such as Japan's Year and The Favourite Flowers of Japan, but this work is a fascinating look at Boehmer's successful export nursery business based in Yokohama.

## Famous Views in Kyoto

### with 20 coloured copperplate prints plus map

[Japan] Very scarce, colour, copperplate printed book illustrating famous sites in Kyoto. Published by the Kyoto Hotel Tokiwa (established in 1888) and, with English titles on the prints and map, clearly aimed at the growing number of Western travellers. The detailed illustrations all by Kyoto-based copperplate printmaker, Ishida Yūnen (1844-1916). Although the cover title is, 'Kyoto Meishi Goju Kei' [50 Views of Famous Places in Kyoto]', it appears only this volume was published and contains a selection of 20 views and collates with a couple of other known copies, except for one at the British Museum which appears to have 30 illustrations. Most prints are dated 1890 and a few 1891. In very nice marbled boards.

#### Showing food presentation and room decoration methods

[Japan] Wonderful, hand-drawn and coloured manuscript book showing the various methods of food presentation and room decoration according to the Ogasawara School, or Ogasawara-ryu, founded in the 13th century. Its way of etiquette is still used by the Japanese Imperial Family today. The manuscript was written by a person named Shigenaga and is dated Tempo 7 (1836).

[Japan] Very scarce programme in English, Chinese and Japanese for a kabuki performance given to Prince Tsai Hsun (1885-1949), who visited Japan in 1910 after visiting Europe and the United States to learn about their navies. He had been appointed acting Navy Minister of China in 1909 and was also known as Zaixun. Along with decorative covers, the book contains three original, colour, woodblock prints.

#### with 16 colour woodblock prints

[Japan] Interesting work containing sixteen unbacked woodblock prints of famous Japanese emperors, artists, and scholars. The personages featured are Emperor Ninkō (1800-46), Emperor Kōkaku (1771-1840), Emperor Kōmei (1831-67), Takano Chōei (1804-50), Sakai Hōitsu (1761-1829), Kariya Ekisai (1775-1835), Sanjo Sanetsumu (1802-59), Tani Bunchō (1763-1841), Tokugawa Iemochi (1846-66), Shibano Ritsuzan (1736-1807), Ii Naosuke (1815-60), Katō Chikage (1735-1808), Otsuki Heisen (1773-1850), Kamo Kunpei (1768-1813), Santō Kyōden (1761-1816), and Go Gekkei (dates unknown). The title in Japanese is, 'Meika Shozo Taikan'. Only two copies at institutes in Japan.

[Japan] Wonderful *orihon* containing twenty *chuban* woodblock prints of famous kabuki actors in roles played at the main theatres in Tokyo, namely the Kabuki-za, the Shin Tomiza and the Meiji-za. The prints are signed Kunihide (1874-1944), of whom little seems to be known.

### Given to a British tourist party



Presumably, he had such prints made to be given to a group from Britain who visited Japan and toured the exchange. Also with two single-page Japanese paper cards printed on both sides from the Osaka Hotel that were also given to members of the tour group.

### including mention of 2 oz. of whiskey in the Medical Emergency Box

[Japan] Although the rules of the U.S. Navy may sound a bit boring, this is actually a very interesting little publication that covers the myriad rules and regulations that officers and crew on navy vessels had to follow whilst in Yokohama and other Asiatic ports. The U.S. Navy commander of the Asiatic Station at the time was Rear Admiral George E. Belknap, who was on the flagship Omaha.



## Echigo - Darkest Japan. The Way Out.

### [Compiled by] Justus L. Cozad

[Japan] Scarce booklet on the work of the American Board of Commissioners for Foreign Missions (ABCFM) in Niigata, Japan. Justus Lafayette Cozad (1833-1920) was a surveyor and railway engineer whose two daughters, Gertrude Cozad (1865-1949) and Jane (Jennie) Cozad (1863-1944) were sent to Niigata (then Echigo) as missionaries in 1888. The booklet mentions how Echigo is the second most populous area of Japan and that young ladies can be sold as merchandise, hence the subtitle, 'Darkest Japan'. A second edition of this publication was published about one year after this one. Most likely one of the earliest publications in English relating to Niigata prefecture.

This rather humorous and *henna* [strange] reader, with decorative covers, contains just fifteen short sentences in English and Japanese, including, 'I am a man', 'She is a nice girl', 'I love her', 'He loves her, too', 'Ladies are fond of dogs', 'What's the matter with you?', and the very useful, 'God damn'!



## Losses Sustained by the Japanese Population of Vancouver, B.C.

### on occasion of the riots in that city in September, 1907

[Japan] Very scarce publication on the so-called Anti-Oriental Riots that occurred from September 7-9, 1907 when generally White, anti-Asian residents believed Japanese, Chinese, and other immigrants were taking "their" jobs. The Deputy Minister of Labour, W[illiam] L[yon] Mackenzie King, C.M.G. (later Prime Miniser of Canada for a total of 21 years) was appointed as Commissioner to investigate the riots. Although the riots led to bans on further Japanese and Chinese immigration, some compensation was paid to those who had had businesses and property damaged.

## The Mineral Wealth of Japan

### by Adj. Prof. Henry S. Munroe

[Japan] Scarce publication by U.S. geologist Henry Smith Monroe (1850-1933), who worked in Japan for the Meiji government from 1872-75, and then Tokyo Imperial University from 1875-76 before returning to the U.S. to study for a PhD at Columbia University. He worked in Hokkaido with Benjamin Smith Lyman (1835-1920), conducting land resources surveys in order to develop Japan's mineral resources there, hence this publication which was also published in Vol. V of, 'Transactions of the American Institute of Mining Engineers'.



[Japan] Benjamin Smith Lyman (1835-1920) was hired by the Meiji government and became Chief Geologist and Mining Engineer during his stay in Japan from 1872-79. He spent a number of years in Hokkaido, hence this publication. Although this copy matches that at archives.org without any maps, other copies appear to have had two maps in the rear. Nothing appears to have been removed in this copy however.

### Saru-Kani Kassen

### Scarce, uncoloured edition in French

[Japan] Lovely, variant, plain paper edition of the fairy tale titled 'Saru Kani Kassen' [The Battle of the Monkey and the Crab] that was translated by Joseph Dautremer (1860-1946). Plain paper editions in French and German are scarcer than their English counterparts. No mention of Hasegawa, only Kobunsha. Artist not mentioned but it was Kobayashi (Sensai) Eitaku. This one is the first we have seen that is uncoloured inside.





He doesn't seem to have produced art for any of Hasegawa's other publications so perhaps there was some problem, but this is speculation of course. We believe only one batch of The Wooden Bowl on plain paper was published.


